Maternal responsiveness and the development of early mother-infant interactions: 'associative learning' and 'functional architecture' accounts

Prof. Lynne Murray, Ph.D.
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Lynne Murray is Professor in Developmental Psychology at the University of Reading, UK, where she directs the Winnicott Research Unit. She also holds honorary chairs at the Universities of Stellenbosch and Cape Town in South Africa. She has studied parent-child relationships for over 30 years, with a particular focus on infancy, in longitudinal and experimental studies, and has used the findings from this basic research to inform interventions. She has worked with populations where parents experience depression, anxiety disorder, or high levels of socio-economic adversity, and where infants have congenital problems, such as cleft lip and palate.
